Seat Allocation Process for B.Tech. and Integrated M.Tech.

This document outlines the process to be followed for seat allocation for the B.Tech. and Integrated M.Tech. programmes Admissions for the year 2024. Seat allocation is done in a transparent manner by sharing all relevant information clearly and in a timely manner so that the candidates and parents can make an informed choice. The timelines for the various activities of the seat allocation process has been chosen such that clash with other centralized counselling like JOSAA is minimized to the extent possible.

Admissions for B.Tech. and Integrated M.Tech. programmes will be done across two types of rounds, namely, **Online Round** and **Campus Round**.

Online Round is conducted without the need for candidates to visit the IIIT-B campus for accepting admission offers. Selected candidates are issued admission offer letter over e-mail and the candidates can accept the admission offer by paying the fees through online payment.

Subsequent to the Online Round, one or more **Campus Rounds** would be conducted if there are vacant seats at the end of earlier Rounds.

This document contains detailed information on the Seat Allocation Process across both types of rounds. Dates for the Seat Allocation Process are provided in this document. Sample Seat Allocation examples are also given at the end of this document to illustrate how preference-based seat allocation would be done.

Criteria for Selection

For every candidate, seat allocation will be done only on the basis of JEE Mains NTA CRL Rank and the number of seats available as per the seat matrix at the time selection. Selection would be done across **ONLINE ROUNDS** and **CAMPUS ROUNDS** as per the announced schedule. Eligibility to be considered for admission does not automatically guarantee admission.

IIIT-B Internal Rank (IIR)

After the application date closes, IIIT-B would be assigning to each candidate **IIIT-B Internal Rank (IIR)** based on the position of the candidate among all those who have applied to IIIT-B for B.Tech. and Integrated M.Tech. programmes. When announcing the cut-offs based on NTA CRL Rank, IIIT-B would also announce the IIR cut-off as well. This information can be useful to the candidate to find out how many candidates are there between their rank and the cut-off rank. Candidates can use this information to determine the likelihood of getting an admission offer in subsequent rounds.



Seat Allocation Process for Online Rounds

A. Admission Offer Letter
1. Seats will be allocated starting with Preference #1 entered by the candidate.
2. If Preference #1 is full, then Preference #2 of the candidate will be checked. If Preference #2 is available, then Preference #2 will be allocated. This process will continue until Preference #5 is processed or until a seat is allocated, whichever is earlier.
3. If a candidate gets allocated any preference other than Preference #1, the candidate will still be eligible for upgrade to any of the HIGHER preferences in future rounds, subject to availability vacant seats.
4. Once a seat is allocated for a given preference, the candidate is not eligible to be considered for any of the LOWER PREFERENCES in the current or future rounds (if any).
5. As per the above process, the candidate is sent applicable Admission Offer Letter for highest preference from among the given candidate preferences for which seat is available.
6. If the candidate does not get Admission Offer Letter in the current round, the candidate is eligible to be considered for ALL preferences in the subsequent online rounds, if any, as per the same process listed here.
B. Admission Offer Acceptance
1. A candidate can ACCEPT an admission offer in a given round by paying applicable fees specified in the admission offer letter by the specified due date. If a candidate does not pay the fees by the specified due date, then the candidate is deemed to have DECLINED the admission offer in that round.
2. Once a candidate DECLINES admission offer letter in a given round, the candidate is NOT ELIGIBLE to claim that seat or any of the LOWER PREFERENCES in any of the future Online Rounds irrespective of the prevailing cut-off for that round. However, the candidate is ELIGIBLE for HIGHER PREFERENCES in subsequent rounds.
3. If a candidate ACCEPTS the admission offer, the candidate continues to be eligible to be considered only for HIGHER PREFERENCES in all subsequent rounds but not for LOWER PREFERENCES .
C. Reporting
1. Candidates who have ACCEPTED admission offer have to report at the IIT-B Campus as per the date notified for Document Verification and Confirmation of Admission Offer .
2. If a candidate fails to report for Document Verification and Confirmation of Admission on the notified date, the candidate is deemed to have DECLINED the admission offer and the seat is released for allocation to subsequent rounds, if any. Refunds for fee already paid will be given as per the Refund policy.



Seat Allocation Process for Campus Rounds

If there are any seats vacant after completing all the Online Rounds, **Campus Round** will be conducted for the purpose of filling the vacant seats with new admission offers. Candidates whose admission is already CONFIRMED can also avail sliding opportunity during the Campus Round. Unlike Online Rounds, the candidate is expected to be available for **IN-PERSON ADMISSION COUNSELING at IIIT-B Campus** during the Campus Rounds. Preferences entered in the application form will not be applicable during the Campus Round.

The Campus Round would follow the process given below:

A. Notification
1. A Campus Round would be conducted only if there are vacant seats available at the end of all the earlier rounds.
2. A notification announcing the Campus Round will be posted in the IIIT-B Admissions website and sent via e-mail to the registered e-mail address of the candidates.
3. Campus Round Cut-off based on NTA CRL Rank would be announced as part of the Notification.
B. Eligibility for Campus Round
1. All candidates who have NTA CRL Rank within the Campus Round Cut-off are ELIGIBLE for this Campus Round, irrespective of preferences entered in the application form.
2. Candidates who have CONFIRMED their seats in one of the earlier rounds are ELIGIBLE for exercising sliding option during the Campus Round .
C. Counselling
1. Campus Round counselling for admissions would be conducted for vacant seats for all the B.Tech. and Integrated M.Tech. programmes on the specified date for available seats on the date of Campus Round.
2. All ELIGIBLE candidates (as per the B above) who are interested should report at the IIIT-B Campus on the date notified and REGISTER in person for the Campus Round. There is NO provision for Online Registration for Campus Round.
3. During the counselling process, each REGISTERED candidate is invited individually in the sequence of NTA CRL Rank and provided with admission options available at that point in time.
4. The candidate can either choose to accept one of the options given or WITHDRAW from the round if they are not satisfied with the options available. Candidates who WITHDRAW from a given round are eligible to appear in future rounds, if any.
5. If a candidate chooses from the given options, admission offer letter is issued to the candidate.
6. For those with CONFIRMED admissions, options to SLIDE across programmes are also provided in the order of NTA CRL Rank.
D. Campus Round Seat Acceptance and Confirmation
1. Those candidates who receive the admission offer in Campus Round must ACCEPT the admission by paying the fees immediately . Details regarding payment mode is included in the Campus Round notification e-mail.
2. Once the fee is paid, the admission is CONFIRMED after completing the document verification
